The Pink Ribbonettes is a local support group comprised of survivors and caregivers of breast cancer. Through their individual experiences, these women have come together to share their stories and offer hope to other women going through breast cancer treatment.



*What do the
Pink Ribbonettes do?*

When a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer, if she wishes, one or two of the members visits with her and offers their support and comfort during her treatment. There are so many things that these survivors had to learn on their own during their treatment, they want to pass their knowledge on to new breast cancer patients to minimize some of the surprises and side effects they may experience. Newly diagnosed women receive a Pink Ribbonettes tote bag to carry with them during their visits for treatment, etc. Inside, there is a small pillow, a journal, pen and other helpful information on surviving the journey of life and cancer treatment.
